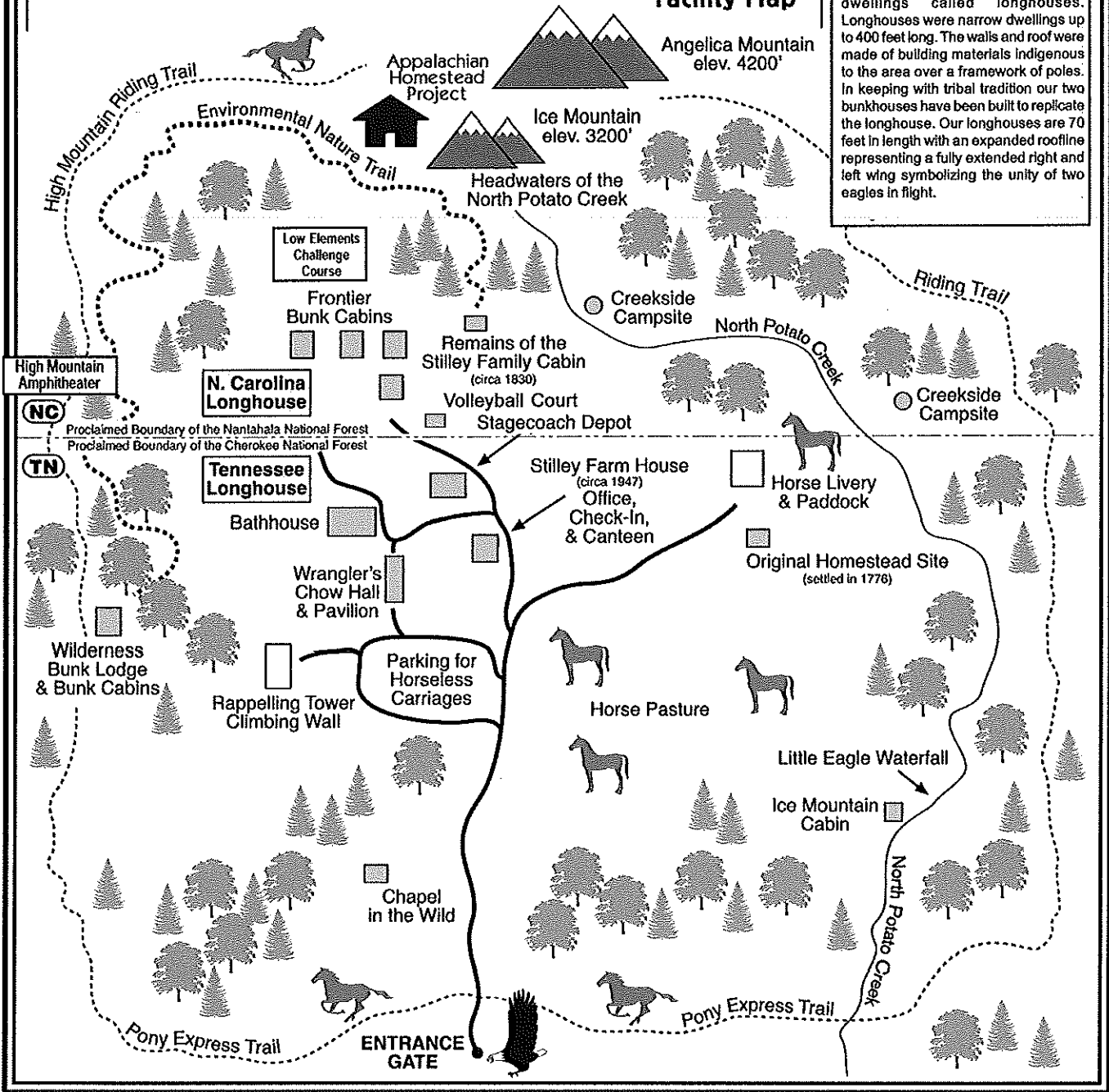


# The Eagle Ranch on Ice Mountain

## Facility Map

Many native North American tribes were not nomadic; therefore, they did not use teepees. They lived in more permanent dwellings called longhouses. Longhouses were narrow dwellings up to 400 feet long. The walls and roof were made of building materials indigenous to the area over a framework of poles. In keeping with tribal tradition our two bunkhouses have been built to replicate the longhouse. Our longhouses are 70 feet in length with an expanded roofline representing a fully extended right and left wing symbolizing the unity of two eagles in flight.
